Your vs you're

Your means belonging to you, or of you.

You're is a contraction of **you are**.

Tip: when you see an apostrophe, you can usually expand the word.

 $\text{`re} \ \rightarrow \ \text{are}$

Examples

You're late. (You are late.)

Your problem. (The problem **belongs to you**.)

You're your own worst enemy. (You are the worst enemy of you.)
